

- ◆ Anyone who just wants to learn more about the Catholic faith to better understand the faith tradition your children are learning or maybe you’ve attended Church with a Catholic friend and would like to know more.

Biography of New Interim Principal for Holy Trinity School

Joana Camacho is a parishioner of Sacred Heart Catholic Church in OKC and serves as a lector, extraordinary minister of Holy Communion and sacristan. She was principal of Sacred Heart from 2003 to 2016, and was named the National Catholic Education Association’s Principal of the Year for Region X (Oklahoma, Texas, Arkansas, Louisiana and New Mexico) in 2011, and has mentored many first-year principals in the Archdiocese of OKC. Joana is a program designer, mentor and presenter in the University of Notre Dame’s Latino Enrollment Institute, which trains Catholic School principals and pastors to welcome Latino families to enroll in Catholic schools. She has worked as a principal and teacher in the Archdiocese of OKC for more than 20 years. Joana is a strong believer in the value of Catholic education in preparing children to be compassionate, servant leaders in the Church and community.

Joana Camacho has been happily married to Bruce Matthyssens for 27 years, and they have two children, Luisa and Michael Matthyssens. Luisa is a graduate of St. Charles Borromeo, Bishop McGuinness Catholic High School, and the University of Central Oklahoma. Michael is currently a senior at Bishop McGuinness. Joana’s parents and older brother and sister emigrated from Cuba to the United States in 1961 to escape Fidel Castro’s communist take-over of the country. She holds a bachelor’s degree, summa cum laude, from Houston Baptist University in elementary and early childhood education, and a master’s degree in school administration from Newman University. Joana is a Houston Baptist University Distinguished Alumnus 2011, and a veteran of the United States Marine Corps. She was appointed interim associate superintendent of Catholic Schools, July, 2016.
